

November, 1963: "Red Letter Day". On invitation by the local Homestead Committee, the Mother Institute of Stoney Creek (organized February 1897, the first W.I. in the world) visited the historic birthplace of our founder, Mrs. Adelaide Hunter Hoodless, at St. George, Ontario. A hand-painted china bowl, filled with yellow marigolds, centred the dining room table where tea was served, with dishes and cloth of that period, a hundred years ago.

In 1964 the Board Members and 400 District Directors from the Ontario Officers' Conference, travelled by bus from Guelph and were entertained in the newly decorated basement to tea.

From the Ontario Historical Society Annual Meeting, held at Brantford in June of this same year, 100 members visited the Homestead and had tea there.

Che Rugayah binte Abdul Majid, Assistant National Organizer of the Sarawak Federation of Women's Institutes, and her husband were entertained in June.
