

David Metcalf bought the West half of Lot 12, Conc. 16 which was 50 acres of bushland in 1877. He built a log house and barn the latter is now a strawshed of the present barn after being moved in 1923.

There is no record of when the first frame house was built or when the wells were dug.

"Kit" Christopher Metcalf a brother of Davids bought the East half of Lot 12, Conc. 16. He never married.

A log house was built and remained there until 1970 when it was sold as a summer cottage. The log barn was burnt in 1903, and the barn was rebuilt in 1905.

In 1918, John the youngest son of David took over the farm. He was a blacksmith and after leaving Lovatt where he had a shop he set one up at his farm. He was married to Elizabeth Polter and they had 3 children; David J., Harry and Irene (Cooper).

David J. or better known as "D.J." and his wife Beryl (Metcalf) took over the farm in 1927. They had 4 children; Lydia (Maitland) Verdella (Stere), Evelyn (Klagues) and Ken.

They lived on this property until 1946 when they moved to Lot 8, Conc. 17.

This farm remained in the Metcalf name until 1976, when it was sold to Glenn Sawyer. A bunker silo was built in 1976.
