

HALL at Corner of Lot 6, Conc. 17

In about 1866 a frame building was built on the corner of Lot 6, Conc. 17 on the farm now owned by Harvey Bell.

It was used as a community hall for all kinds of meetings, Orange Lodge Unity 443, Granger & Patrons of Industry, the Beef ring and school picnics.

There are records of the Unity 443 meetings from 1871 to 1892 and these are neither the first or the last records.

The year Mr. Donnelly had 100 acres of peas, he used the hall to feed and house the threshing gang.

In 1917, when Wm. Wangler owned the farm it was torn down. The shed was moved up to the Webb farm as a driving shed.
