Craft fair draws 10,000

SOUTHAMPTON — The country and rural flavor continued to bring success at the 22nd annual Bruce Centre District Women's Institute Craft and Hobby Fair.

The show, held Thursday at the Southampton Coliseum saw about 10,000 people come and go, to buy or view the wares of 200 yendors.

Brenda MacDonald, one of the committee organizers, said the 10 women's institutes in the Bruce Centre District do not allow commercial vendors and there is a waiting list of almost 200 vendors who want to participate.

Last year about \$11,000 in proceeds from the show was given to area organizations.

MacDonald said all the help is by volunteers and the committee attempts to avoid duplication when they select the vendors.

Several vendors sold all their merchandise or crafts, while others commented that sales were down a bit over last year.

But all the vendors were unanimous in one aspect — it is the best attended and organized shows of its kind.
