This branch at Saugeen is of particular interest because it was on the Saugeen Indian Reservation at Southampton. This branch appeared to have been quite active for a time, but in 1937, no officers were available and the branch was not recorded after that date. Mrs. Ritchie and later her daughter, Eleanor, held convenerships with the district. On several occasions musical numbers were contributed by the members to the District Annual progamme. Often these numbers were in the Ojibway language.
