

LORD TWEEDSMUIR, the son of the Rev. John Buchan, was born John Buchan in Scotland August 25, 1875. He was an historian and novelist. He was called to the Bar in 1901 and from 1927 to 1935 was a member of the British House of Commons for Scottish Universities. In 1935 he was titled "Baron Tweedsmuir" and the same year became Governor-General of Canada. He died in Montreal on February 11, 1940.

Lord Tweedsmuir wrote many novels, biographies and historical works, and his latest was his autobiography "Memory Hold the Door". His library was bequeathed to Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario.

LADY TWEEDSMUIR, Susan, has written many plays, children's books and reminiscences. She was an ardent Women's Institute member in England and was made an Honorary Life Member of F. W. I. O. During her stay in Canada she advocated that the Institutes across the Nation compile histories of their villages and communities.

Although in advanced years, Lady Tweedsmuir has not lost her keen interest in the Institute work in Canada as seen by her letter which appeared in Home and Country, Summer 1973.
