I joined the 98th Battery in 1937 and served with it until July, 1940 when I joined Active Service. We were called the 98th Anti Tank Battery, 4th Anti-Tank Regiment, 5th Division and were stationed in Listowel and Pettawa.

We went overseas in October, 1941 where we trained for Invasion in Aldershot, England and Brighton on the south Coast. We were ready to go to France on the Dieppe Raid, but were called back. We then left for Italy in October, 1943, but we had a stopover in Africa, in Algeria. We landed in Italy on New Year's Day, 1944. We then spent eighteen months fighting in Italy. Then when the war was won in Italy we left Leghorn, Italy for Marseilles, France.

We went up through Ypres to Belgium, where we went back into action and into Holland. We ended up in Germany when the war was over. I returned home in September, 1945.
