## JOHN GORDON GRIEVE

Gordon Grieve, Private C16682 was the son of Mr. & Mrs. Irving Grieve of Saugeen Township. He attended S.S. #7, Saugeen and Port Elgin High School. He enlisted on June 2, 1941.

Gordon trained at Debut, Nova Scotia until September 15, 1941 when he was sent to England. While there he contacted polio and spent quite some time in hospital at Oxford and later at the Canadian Army Hospital at Bainingstoke.

Gordon was sent home from England on April 23, 1944. Two doctors in England had assured him that he was doomed to alife in wheel chair. Gordon was determined and recovered sufficiently from back and leg paralysis to farm. He was discharged from the army on September 2, 1944.
