Size -
Ten Acres located on the West side of Catherine Street allowance.

Parking Area -
Ample provision for bus transportation of children; loading, unloading, and bus turning.

Spaces for 28 parked cars.

PORT ELGIN - SAUGEEN CENTRAL SCHOOL

September 22, 1965	At the regular monthly meeting, Port Elgin Public School Board felt that it must give attention to provision of additional accommodation for its 328 students.
October 27, 1965	At the request of Saugeen Township School Area Board, a Joint Meeting was held with the Port Elgin Public School Board to discuss the possibility of amalgamation. It was decided to invite the Inspector, Mr. W.S. MacInnes, to attend a future meeting and explain amalgamation procedures for the two Boards and the representatives of Councils of Port Elgin and Saugeen.
November 9, 1965	Inspector stated that some advantages of larger central schools are: better teaching, better equipment, avoidance of duplication of facilities which would occur if each Board built its own school. The earliest effective date for amalgamation would be January 1, 1967.
June 1, 1966	After several joint meetings the two Boards and Council Representatives met with the Bruce County Consultative Committee. Amalgamation agreement was reached on the understanding that any new building would be on a new site.
June 10, 1966	Bruce County By-Law #1934 added all of the Port Elgin Public School section to the Township School Area of Saugeen effective January 1, 1967.
June 22, 1966	District Inspector estimated required accommodation at 15 Rooms plus Auditorium if an all-new school were to be built; 12 Rooms plus Auditorium would suffice if the 3 Rooms of Port Elgin Public School were to be retained.
August 9, 1966	Inspector requested tentative approval of a building proposal. Accommodation requested from Department of Education was 12 Classrooms, 1 Library and 1 Playroom.
August 16, 1966	A Department of Education letter stated that abandonment of 3 Rooms at Port Elgin Public School would result in a Grant reduction of \$49,200.00 on the new building.
