

## Notes of Historical Interest

Prince Edward the Prince of Wales, came up river by boat in the year <sup>1860</sup> and was entertained at ~~Farrell's point on the Ottawa~~ <sup>McCaupling at Campbell's</sup>. The Prince lifted Josh Farrell, a child, into his arms and titled him "Prince Jocky". A red carpet was rolled on the shore for the Prince to step on from the boat. Miss Nora Somerville still has a scrap of this cloth which had been made into a skirt for a little Farrell girl. (1956 write up)

Alfred Obrey sold 50 cord of stones off the property that now belongs to Campbell Humphries. West of Half Lot 9. Con. 8, to the boom at \$1 a cord, about the year 1906. Lorne C. Humphries helped draw the stones with team and sleigh from the farm to the river.

In the autumn of 1991 a dredging firm hauled stone up out of the cribs in the bay in front of Humphries farms. No more hauling of logs downriver to the mill is allowed.
