Have two hospital beds to rent for use in community. Had short courses on meat cookery, oven meals, jelly and jammaking, salads, and vegetables. Jam made and sent overseas. Local leadership on buymanship, wool, cotton, rayon, linen, and silk, refinishing furniture, quilt making, slip covers and many more.

AGRICULTURE AND CANADIAN INDUSTRIES

Address, Agriculture Basis for our National Prosperity. Talks on care of house plants, weeds, and weed control. Main industries are cheese factory, tobacco growing, grist and saw mill, where much lumber is cut into lumber. Speakers from the department of agriculture at one meeting each year. Mr. Sterling spoke in 1950 on farm prices as to industrial reports.

CITIZENSHIP AND EDUCATION

Address on our flag, our national holidays, training our youth for citizenship. Had speakers from the department of agriculture, also local ministers.
