

MRS. ADELAIDE HUNTER HOODLESS

Adelaide Hunter Hoodless was born in 1857 at the homestead near St. George, Ontario. With the assistance and encouragement of the Erland Lee family, the first Women's Institute organization was founded on February 19, 1897 at Stoney Creek, Ontario.

She died in the year 1910.

The homestead was made an Historic Site at an unveiling ceremony on June 13, 1959.

Mrs. Adelaide Hoodless was cited as a National Figure at an impressive unveiling of a plaque in her honor at the Homestead on June 2, 1962, by the National Historic Site Board.
