## Gets provincial appointment

## Harron quits politics for OMB

Gary Harron, the popular and well-known reeve of Amabel Township, is leaving about 13 years of municipal politics behind this fall for a job with the provincial government.

Harron. 45. a prominent local Progressive Conservative party organizer who ran for the PCs in Huron-Bruce in the last provincial election, was appointed Monday to the Ontario Municipal Board, effective Dec. 1. He will deal primarily with assessment appeals, he said.

Harron said late Monday night he is "very, very pleased" with the appointment to the

\$55,000-to-\$60,000 a year job, but said he leaves municipal politics with "mixed emotions." Municipal politics has been good to him, he said.

One of the active promoters of the proposed Bruce Energy Park, Harron said he would have like to pushed it some more, stating he expects some major developments to occur in the near future.

But Harron said he probably got the job because of his experience in municipal politics and other provincial agencies. He is also a member of the Niagara Escarpment Commis-

Harron was Bruce County warden in 1978

and is chairman of the county economic development committee.

At Monday night's Amabel council meeting he announced he will not run for re-election this fall, he said. He will also step down from the NEC and as head of the economic development committee at the end of November, he said

Harron is a native of Elsinore, where he still operates a beef farm with his wife Yvonne. They have two daughters, Tammi, 19, and Lisa, 12.

The new posting may involve moving closer to Toronto, but no decision on that has been made yet. Harron said.
