Mrs. W. Reid dies suddenly in **London University Hospital**

On Tuesday, August 24 at the University hospital, London, Ontario, death came suddenly to Juanita, Mrs. Wilfred Reid, of the fourth concession, Elderslie Township. In her fifty-fourth year, she was the former Juanita Jacklin of the twelfth concession, Brant township.

In apparent good health within less than a week before her death she was taken to the Chesley hospital for treatment. It was found necessary to take her by amublance to the University hospital, London. A critical condition developed rapidly and the end came suddenly on Tuesday morning. 
