

Flower show

The Chesley and District Horticulture Society held their annual flower show on Wednesday, August 15, in the Chesley Community Centre with over 300 flower arrangements and plants.

President, Clarence Lang, welcomed the large crowd in attendance and said it was the best display ever held in Chesley. He thanked Chesley town council for the generous grant and the business people of the town for special prizes donated.

However, he showed concern about the apparent vandalism. He noted some of the large flower pots had only two flowers remaining in them.

Vice-President, Suzie Scheus, introduced the guest speaker, Bruce McCull of Brussels, who is owner of the stock yards, member of the Matford Conservation Authority and a farmer. He told of observing flowers as he travelled around Ontario on business trips and observed evidence of a horticulture at work.
