Bruce Library get 2 grants for \$25,806

The Bruce County Public Library will receive two grants totalling \$25,806 to purchase multicultural library materials and present new library programs.

The grants were announced at the Bruce County Library

The grants were announced at the Bruce County Library in Port Elgin on Saturday by Health Minister Murray Elston on behalf of Citizenship and Culture Minister Lily Munro.

on behalf of Citizenship and Culture Minister Lily Munro. A grant of \$25,000 will be used to purchase multicultural materials including cassettes and films. French language tapes and tape recordings will also be purchased for the francophone community. In addition, large print materials will be bought to meet the needs of the handicapped and elderly. A portion of the grant will be spent on native materials which are used by the Saugeen Indian Band.

New library events and programs will be funded by the second grant. This grant of \$806 will be matched by local community funds for a total of \$1,612. The money will be used to sponsor theatrical performances and children's programmes.

Planned performances include a Raggedy Ann and Andy show at the Paisley library and performances by the Erewhon Theatre group.

The \$25,000 grant will be added to by donations from Bruce County (\$11,862), the Port Elgin Royal Canadian
