- Any errors or omissions must be reported to the Department of Agriculture, Renfrew, before October 15th,
- 1939. Books are closed on that date. Anyone found making a dishonest exhibit or in any way breaking the rules will forfeit all prize money and will be debarred from competition for one year.
- Where there is more than one room in a School, each room must compete as a separate unit.

Contests will likely be held in the Pembroke and Renfrew Collegiates on the nights of OCTOBER 12th and 13th, respectively.
