

51. **IDENTIFICATION OF BIRDS**—Not more than 2 entries from a school or room. Pupils will identify birds from colored plates. Pupils entering class 51, NOT ELIGIBLE for classes 52, and vice versa.
52. **SEED NAMING**—Not more than 2 entries from a school or room. Pupils will identify various seeds of common grains, clovers and grasses from samples.

NON-COMPETITIVE SCHOOL EXHIBITS

In order for a school or room to compete for County or District School Fair honors, it is obligatory that the school or room should enter a School Display.

School Exhibits should cover one or more of the following subjects — Health, English, Social Studies, Natural Science, Art, Crafts, Home Economics, Agriculture and Science.

Each subject should be kept distinct in the exhibit. The Teacher and a committee of 3 or 4 senior pupils will be allowed between 9 and 10.30 a.m. on the day of the fair, to arrange the exhibit. The exhibit may either demonstrate a lesson or be a display of work done in the school on the subject or subjects.

SIZE OF EXHIBIT — Corrugated paper backgrounds, which will be supplied free of charge, will be 5 feet wide at the front, 4 feet 6 inches wide at the back, 3 feet 6 inches high and 21 inches wide, and will be used for each School Display. This background will be available on the morning of the School Fair or may be secured any time after June 1st from the Department of Agriculture at Renfrew, or from the office of Mr. N. Campbell, the School Inspector at Pembroke.

Each school or room will also be allowed \$3.00 in prize money to help defray the expense in arranging the school exhibit. Any balance may be used for school purposes in which pupils would be interested.

DEMONSTRATIONS

INTER SCHOOL CHORUS—Each School will sing 3 stanzas or 1 verse and the chorus twice of a well-known song. It is suggested that the number be chosen from the New Educational Music Course (Cringan) Teacher's Edition. Points only will be awarded, 3 points per pupil for the three schools taking the first three highest number of points, and 2 points per pupil for each other school entering. Points per pupil based on the number taking part.

Demonstration on the treatment for Warble Fly Control—All schools to be prepared to give the demonstration, but only one school will be chosen on the day of the Fair. Two pupils to demonstrate the treatment on a calf. An outline of the demonstration will be supplied to each school. A calf, brush, pail, powder, water and mixer will be supplied on the day of the Fair, also a chart showing the life cycle of the warble fly.

Demonstration of First Aid—Demonstrate treatment for a cut artery. All Schools to be prepared to give the demonstration, but only one School will be chosen on the day of the Fair. Two pupils to be a team to demonstrate.

PHYSICAL EXERCISES AND ORGANIZED GAMES

No pupils of the First and Second grades are to take part. Physical exercises shall be given according to the Syllabus of Physical Training for Schools, 1935.

Each School to prepare one lesson from 1-18 pages 208-248 with any changes he or she may wish to include, but each demonstration to follow the order of these lessons.

This part of the programme will take place in the morning immediately after the sports. Each school taking part will be awarded 5 points per pupil. This part of the program will not be judged.

PARADE—The parade will not be judged and no prizes will be given, but 5 points per pupil will be given to each School taking part.

NOTE—In the above two demonstrations, the number of pupils will be the number actually taking part.

SPECIAL PRIZE—Each school taking part in the parade, Organized Games and Inter-School Chorus Demonstration, will receive a choice of suitable flowers, shrubs or vines for beautification of the school or grounds. This prize will be mailed out, postage paid, for spring planting in 1940. Prizes for these classes are provided by the Renfrew County Grant to Rural School Fairs.

HORSE SHOE PITCHING

Preliminaries will be played off on the morning of the School Fair, and the finals will be held in the afternoon. The winners from each School Fair will compete for the County Championship on the day of the Championship Contests, if such are held, otherwise a special day will be selected for this competition. Rules and regulations etc. will be the same as for 1938. A silver trophy is being offered to the winners of the County Championship. The trophy offered by Mr. F. D. Vickers of Renfrew is offered for annual competition, and was won in 1937 by Petawawa Seniors, and in 1938 by the Haleys Station School.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. To be eligible for the Championship Cup or Prize, the School or Room must enter the Parade, the School Games, and must put on a creditable School Display.
2. Competition open to pupils who are attending Public or Separate School at the time of the Fair. This includes pupils who try the Entrance in June, 1939, although they may be taking advanced work at the time of the fair. The class in which a pupil can exhibit, to be determined by the grade in which he or she was on June 1st, 1939.
3. No entry fee shall be charged on any exhibit.
4. No admission fee shall be charged.
5. Only one entry may be made in any one class by each pupil.
6. Exhibits must be on the Fair Grounds by 10.30 the day
