

Skating Rink

A skating rink flourished for a number of years, situated on the corner of John W. Hamilton's farm, beside the village. This provided sport and recreation for both young and old. Hockey matches were played by the home team and other neighbouring teams from Calabogie, Admaston and others. There was a suitable building with a stove for heating, a place to rest and get warm between skating periods and there was also a building used for a dressing room for use of the hockey players

Seasons tickets were: Gentlemen \$2.00, Ladies \$1.00
