MAIL SERVICE. The first Post Office in This School Section was inquindy's store, and was called Harvey P.O. "Paddy" Doolan brought the mail from Amprior Three times a week, going by White Lake, Buinstown, Haway, and Stewastville, He had a span of horses which made the trip, summer and winter, Later The P. O. was moved to andrew youngs residence. Then down to Glasgow, after the building & The Rail road, and The name changed to Glasgow Station, mo J. B. Hutson was Post mistress for grite a number of years, Then it was moved to Robert Cherry house , When Kural Mail Welevery was established in Glasgow, mail for The surrounding districts was brought on The train to The Station, and distributed by Runal Mail Conviers, a soule of 24 miles. The first mail convier was angus H. M-I mes, who served for years, Then m 1917. Robert Cherry took over, Then James Cherry and James Carawell. Reid Carswell, Laylor Carswell, Kenneth Gillan, and Carswell Simpsion who started m 1941.
