The people of this community, hearing of the success of Rural telephones in other communities, decided to do something about it, do in 1910 a. J. Linds ay of Lochwinnoch section, and andrew Carwell of Glasgow canvasced both communities, and with a very few exceptions, all were two about to the project. The Renfrew Mercury was interviewed, and a meeting was called which he attended, giving information as to the method of forming a Rural Galephone to.

By-laws were drawn up and Officers elected.

The avitable awas placed in private residences for the first few years. Then as this was not satisfactory, a brilding was purchased, the store and residence of Robert Storie, who had gone West, and the switchboard was installed there.

This method gave great satisfaction, and the Rural Felephone has become a necessity in a sural community, as well as a Social commodity.
