Man, 84, killed

An 84-year-old Arnprior area man died late Friday evening in the Civic hospital in Ottawa from multiple injuries he suffered in a car accident on Highway 17 at Glasgow Station.

The Renfrew OPP report that Celesta Hamilton of RR 2 Arnprior was crossing Highway 17 on County Road 9 when his car was in collision with a westbound car. Hamilton was northbound in his 1967 Chevrolet at about 4.45 pm.

Three persons in the other vehicle, the driver, Ethyl Irene Salter, 61, of Harry Street, Renfrew, her husband, Claude Salter 64, and Michael Salter, 6, were all taken to Renfrew Victoria Hospital. Mr and Mrs Salter were treated and released. Michael was admitted and is in satisfactory condition.

The investigating officer reported that visibility was clear at the time of the crash, even though the pavement was wet.

Celesta Hamilton

Celesta Hamilton of McNab Township died in Ottawa hospital on Friday, September 19, at the age of 84.

Mr Hamilton had been a lifelong resident of McNab, except for a period of ten years spent out west. He was educated at Glasgow Station and had been a farmer all his working years. He was a member of Glasgow United Church.

Mr Hamilton was the son of the late Thomas Hamilton and his wife Bethea Lavallee. His wife, the former Janet Forrest, predeceased him. He is survived by daughters Janet (Mrs Wilfred Quesnell), Ottawa; Marion (Mrs Carl McWilliams), Toronto; Rosemarie (Mrs Paul Latter), Orleans; a brother, Andrew of RR 2, Arnprior; and sisters Catherine (Mrs Carl Harmon), Scarboro, Maine; Margaret (Mrs Frank Liscombe), Portland, Maine.
