This volume of our Tweedsmir History was complied and written by Mrs. Walter MacKenzie. Mrs. MacKenzie (Donalda McDairmid) was a long time member of the Kairshea United Farmers Women's Organization and a Charter member of the Kairshea Women's Institute.

She was born on Con.4, Kinloss Tw., the daughter of Mr. & Mrs. John McDairmid. She received her education at S.S. 6, Kinloss and later took her nurses training at Hopper Hospital, Detroit. She married Walter MacKenzie in 1926. They resided on the grooms farm Et Lot 3 and Lot 4.

She sparked the idea of Bruce Co. Museum and worked very hard achieving same.

After her husband passed away in 1955 she sold the farm to Mr. Virden Mowbray. Many antiques from the farm and home were sent to the Museum in Southampton. Mrs. MacKenzie moved to Lucknow where she lived for several years, then to a Nursing Home in Goderich where she died in 1968.
