

years. On Apr. 30 - 1906, Mrs. Helen and Margaret Hudson sold the farm to Roderick Mac Dougall of Chicago for \$500⁰⁰. Apr. 18 - 1922 Roderick Mac Dougall sold to Edward Little of Detroit for \$6300⁰⁰. Apr. 4 - 1950 Edward Little sold to Fred Gilchrist for the sum of \$6300. Mr. & Mrs. Little moved to a new home in Lucknow. Ed. Little died in Dec. 1954. Their son Mr. Jas. E. Little has been a successful dentist in Lucknow since his graduation in 1935.

The Patent for this land from the Crown was issued Apr. 1 - 1868 to Valentine Alton for the sum of \$150⁰⁰. Feb. 2 - 1872 it was sold to Ann Little, - July 3 - 1928 Ann Little conveyed the land to her son Albert Little. May 2 - 1946 Albert Little and his wife Higa conveyed the land to the Director of the Veterans Hand Act. June 1946 Mr. Clifford James Poulston and his wife Mary E., acquired this farm.

The old log school, the first school in Kinloss I. Jr., was on the N. West corner of this lot. There was no mention of the school recorded on the deed, but it was attended by close to 100 pupils before the opening of the Grey Oak School in Jan. 1875. During the winter months the older members of the families went to school to get additional education. Young men of 18 yrs. and older attended. For a time there were the family of Wm. Mac Donald living in the old school, after the Grey Oak school was opened. They were known as the "School MacDonalds". Mr. & Mrs. Poulston have three children, - Mrs. Poulston's mother, Mrs. Alex Purves and her son Elliot also live with them.
