

W. 21. Lot 7. Con. 3. Kinloss. - This 50 ac. is part of the land Mr. Peter Mac Kinnon from the Isle of Skye, Scotland reserved to be divided between his twelve children, six sons and six daughters. When his daughter Bella married John Mac Dougall they settled on this 50 ac. They later moved to Dakota and Angus MacLeod, across the road bought this land, which continued in his name until his death in 1911. His son Peter lived on it from the time of his marriage. He died here in 1920, and his children were born and grew to womanhood on this farm. His son John worked it however and it was always known as his farm. When Angus MacLeod died in 1911 this 50 ac. went to his son John and the 100 ac. across the road was left to his son Peter's widow and two daughters. John and his wife came to this farm in 1912 and after his wife's death he moved to Rucknow in 1925. He sold this farm and the 75 ac. east of it to Dan Mac Kinnon in 1925. On Dan Mac Kinnon's death in 1932 his son Fraser acquired this property.



E. 21. Lot 7 & W. 25 ac. of Lot 8. - The first settler on this 75 ac. was Angus Mac Kinnon, a son of Peter Mac Kinnon. When he moved away in the 1880's he sold it to John MacLeod. He sold it in 1925 to Dan Mac Kinnon. On his death in 1952 it became the property of his son, John Mac Kinnon.

East 75 ac. of Lot 8. Con. 3. Kinloss. - This 75 ac. belonged to Kinnon Mac Kinnon and his wife Christena Livingston. They lived here from about 1866 until they retired to Rucknow in 1917. They raised a family of four sons and three daughters and were a fine example in the community. In 1917 their youngest son, Dan, and his wife Isabel Mac Donald took over this farm. They had a family of two sons and two daughters. Dan died on Jan. 21 - 1952. Their son John now owns this property and he and his mother reside here.
