

Lot 2. Con. 3. ^{Huron} ~~Karloss~~ - Nov. 4-1872. to Chas. Bingham from the Crown. Mar. 25-1873. - From Chas. Bingham to Thos. Mac Iver. Feb. 6-1907 - From Thos. Mac Iver to his sons, Donald S. and Laughlin Mac Iver. Dec. 5. -1911 - Equity of Donald S. Mac Iver transferred to Laughlin Mac Iver. May 16-1942 - Laughlin Mac Iver to Donald J. Mac Iver.

Thos. Mac Iver came to this farm as a young man in 1873. His wife died when his children were quite young, so he re-married. - his second wife was a young widow with one son - the Thos. Ross referred to later in this book, who now at 95 years still plays the pipes twice weekly. Mr. Mac Iver and his second wife Mrs. Ross had a family of five children and his wife used to refer to their family as, "his, mine and ours". Their son Laughlin married Margaret La Chappell of Harrisburgh, Mich. on July 8-1903. They raised a family of three girls and a boy on this farm, the son Donald Thos. taking over the farm from his father in May, 1942. In Oct. 1942 Donald J. Mac Iver married Grace Blake of Ashfield Twp. They had three sons, Jack and twins Donald and Ronald. Mr. & Mrs. Mac Iver moved to E. H. of Lot 1, Con 3 after the marriage of their son and after his death to an apartment in Lucknow, where Mrs. Mac Iver still resides. They celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in July 1953. Mr. Mac Iver died in 1954. Their son Donald J. was fatally injured on Nov. 1-1951. while helping to dismantle an old barn on Con 6 Karloss. His wife Grace sold this property in 1952 to Richard and Austin Martin. Austin Martin was married in Oct. of 1933 to Joan Turner of Owen Sound and Richard and Mrs. Martin moved to this property. Mrs. Don Mac Iver returned to teaching in 1952 and she and her three sons reside in London, Ont.

Lot 1. Con. 3. Huron. - This property was taken up from the Crown by Donald Beaton in Feb. 1864. On the death of Donald Beaton ^{the} ~~it~~ became the property of his son John. John Beaton sold it to Ezekiel Hodgskin on Mar. 12-1905. Ezekiel Hodgskin gave an undivided half interest to his wife Biddelia Hodgkinson on Oct. 20-1920. In Oct. 1940 Biddelia Hodgskin conveyed it to her son Henry Hodgkinson. On Apr. 1944. Henry Hodgkinson sold it to Donald J. Mac Iver. On Don's death Nov. 1-1951. it reverted to his wife Grace Mac Iver. She sold it to Richard and Austin Martin.
