

Lot 1. Con. 4. Kinloss

and Lot 2. Con. 4. Kinloss - Thos. Stinson bought lots 1 and 2 Con. 4 Kinloss from the Crown on Nov. 3rd. 1862 for \$300.⁰⁰ On May 1st. 1863 he sold them to John Mac Donald for \$3200.⁰⁰ Jan. 7 - 1866 John Mac Donald sold Lot. 2. to his brother Donald Mac Donald, Donald Mac Donald died in 1896 leaving a family of three sons and three daughters, who continued to work the farm together. On July 29 - 1905 the other members of the family, gave "Quit Claim Deeds" to Kenneth Mac Donald. The title was registered in 1911. On Oct. 1. - 1930 Kennie Mac Donald gave title to this property to Kennie Mac Kenzie for value received. On June 1. - 1932 The Administrator of the Estate of Kennie Mac Donald gave title to Kennie Mac Kenzie. Mar. 7. - 1933. Richard and Emily Mac Diullan and Rachael Mac Diullan gave title to Kennie Mac Kenzie (These titles must involve chattel mortgages) July 11. - 1933 from K. R. MacKenzie to Annie Buckton. Oct. 14. - 1938 from Mrs. A. Buckton to Herb Buckton. Oct. 7. - 1942. discharge of mortgage to K. R. MacKenzie from Herbert and Mary Buckton - the first clear title since 1862.

History of Lot 1. - from Jan. 1866 -

Lot 3. Con. 4. Kinloss. - Alexander Mac Donald, or "Big Sandy" as he was known, was born in Prince Edward Island in 1831 and came to the Queen's Bush in 1852 and took up this lot from the Crown. In 1857 he married Mary Stewart, from the Parish of Kilmuir, Isles of Skye, Scotland. They had a family of five sons and four daughters, and spent the balance of their lives on this farm, both living to be over 80 yrs. of age. They lived to celebrate their fifty fifth wedding anniversary. Their son John took over the farm about 1885. He was presentor in South Kinloss church for 62 yrs. He died in 1942 and the farm was sold on May 10 - 1943 to Wm. Ernie. He sold it in the spring of 1952 to Harvey Houston, who still owns it.
