It was sold in Jan. 1945 to D.L. Mac Kenzie and is now owned and occupied by his son James and his wife Lois Richie and three young sons.
Mrs. Peter MacLeod died in 1948 at the age of eighty nine years.

Taken up from Crown in 1854 by John MacKinnon
by 1900 - it was owned by John and Malcolm MacKinnon
1940 - Peter MacKinnon
1953 - Bought by Thomas Auston - Harold & Anne
Auston lived here. They had 3 sons. Robert, Donald
and Gary. Moved to Lucknow in 1960.

This property is now owned by Omer Brooks.
He built a large silo adjoining barn and

This farm was taken up from the Crown
Jan. 30. - 1877 by Alexander MacLeod. for \$50. On May 5 - 1919 it was
deeded to his son Donald A. MacLeod. Sold on Apr. 78 - 1921 to Rod
MacDougall. Deeded to his son Lloyd MacDougall Dec. 1. - 1944. He
built a modern house on the property in 1942. He was married
in Oct. 1942 to Anna May Garrish. They and their young son
Allan and daughter Grace Ann live in this attractive home.
