

1966 Kairshea W.I. assisted Holyrood W.I. to serve at Warden's Banquet. The Warden was P.A. Murray.

A new roof was put on the Hall. A hospital room was chosen in the new building at Wingham and District Hospital. The Home Economics Scholarship was discontinued after 1966. A reprint of 200 more Books of Dean MacLeod's Poems was ordered.

1967 A Centenneal Rose Quilt and a Crib Quilt were made and ticets were sold.

Kairshea was hostess for the District Annual in Lucknow.

A special Centennial Calico Ball was held in Lucknow District High School. A former member Miss Jessie McKay received a gift from Kairshea on her 100th birthday.

1968 The school bell was sold to Dr Olser Lockhart for \$50.00 and the teacher's desk to Lloyd MacDougall for \$10.00.

A new ceiling and a double sink were improvements to the Hall.

1969 Betty Colwell, a 4-H member, was chosen to go to the Girls' Conference at Guelph.

Each year a bus tour was enjoyed since 1966. These included a Mystery Tour in Lucknow, industries in Goderich, Kincardine are, Collingwood and Stratford, and one special one to see Anne of Green Gables at Toronto.

1970 More vandalism at the Hall occurred and 46 panes of glass were broken.

In June it was decided to have Sunshine Sisters.

The woodshed was sold to Spence McFarlan for \$20.00.

Kairshea has coninued to sponsor 4-H Homemaking Courses, and many girls in the community have received training in the courses offered. Many have received their County and Provincial Honours, and one leader, Mrs Jim Burt received her Five Year Award. Several leaders were guests at Royal Winter Fair. On several occasions the 4-H Clubs have entertained the Institute members at dinners, teas, films, and demonstrations. Much credit is due to the many Institute members who have been leaders.

Activities to raise money included quilts, catering to banquets and weddings, dances, bake sales and bakeless bake sale, booths at auction sales, and Lucknow Craft Festival.

In meetings and all activities the Kairshea Institute members continue to be a very congenial group who enjoy working and being together whenever there is an opportunity. There were 30 members in 1960 and 30 in 1970.
