The family of Michael Kenny were the original settlers on this farm. Mr. Kenny used to be a miner. The first school house was on the sideroad on this farm ..It was later moved to Langside. The children, on going to school knew only two words of English -"yes"and"no", but the teacher being Scottish also knew the Gaelic and they were soon able to converse in both languages. This farm was owned by the Kenny's son Dennis until 1947, when he sold it to Wm.

James Kenny settled on this farm about 1865. A creek ran thru' north part of farm and supplied water.
