 Re: spelling of name. In Scotland there are three spellings  
 in use. MacMillan, McMillan, and M'Millan.

It is difficult to find a rule to decide which is which.  
 As the spoken word comes before the written, it is quite  
 possible the spelling follows the pronunciation. The  
 original spoken word being Gaelic, it follows that MAC might  
 be considered nearer that pronunciation. This spelling  
 became abbreviated to M' or MC by those who emphasized the  
 MILLAN. Apparently different members of the clan spelled  
 the name using these three spellings, and there seems to be  
 no distinction as to geographical location, or even to  
 colloquial usage. Whether it be Edinburgh, or Glasgow, or  
 the country villages, or Canadian cities or towns, or the  
 U.S.A. or Australia or the fringes of Asia or Africa  
 the name is spelled commonly MAC, but also MC or M'.
