## LOT 1, CONCESSION 5, KINLOSS DONALD MACLEOD and FAMILY

Donald MacLeod
His parents were from Invernessahire, Scotland.

Born October 20, 1832 in Orwell, Prince Edward Island, Canada.

Died - November 18, 1909 in Kinloss, and is buried in South Kinloss
cemetery near Lucknow, Ont. He married Mary Martin in 1859, and four of
their children were born in Prince Edward Island before he came to Kinloss
in 1867 and purchased Lot 1. Con.5, from Sam Roach. He was a builder and
stone mason and built his first house of logs, also a log barn. He used a
team of exen before acquiring a team of horses. Some time later, he built
a frame barn and drive-shed. In 1889 he built the present stone house.
Late in 1867 his wife and four children came by boat to Goderich then by
stage coach to Kinloss. Township.

Mary Martin of Valleyfield, Prince Edard Island

Born - in 1837 at Staffin Bay, Isle of Skye, Scotland. Her father was William (More) Martin. He moved his family to Prince Edward Island, Canada in 1840. Her seven year old brother, Donald, was the first white person to sleep in a house in the whole district of Valleyfield. The home of William Martin, the first citizen, was selected as the first religious meeting house and was used during 1841 and into 1842 when the first meeting house of logs was built.

Died September 5, 1914 in Ripley, Ontario and was buried in South Kinloss Cenetery, Lucknow.Ont.
