This farm was originally settled by a family named MacKenzie. A son, Alexander, taught school but it is not known what became of them, and no one has lived on this farm since. It was owned by William Valens who sold it to Adam MacDonald in 1903. On his death his son, John, acquired it and on John's death it became the property of his nephew, Allister Hughes.
