OPP make public plea for help 1997

OPP investigating the disappearance of Lois Hanna over eight years ago have issued a plea for the public's help.

They are requesting that anyone who took pictures - stills or videos - of the Sunday afternoon and evening events, that were part of Lucknow's 1988 reunion, dig them up and loan them to the investigating team.

Detective Sergeant Al Robertson told the Sentinel last Friday that it doesn't matter if you have the negatives. "Even if they think they are of no importance, we want to look at them," said Robertson. What may seem trivial to the public could be a very important piece of the

Please find your pictures and drop them off at the Town Hall. Simply make sure your name, address and phone number are on them and the pictures will be returned.

Within 24 hours of last Thursday's press conference by OPP and the Hanna family, two dozen tips were received, said OPP Detective Bill McKeag, who has been on the Hanna case since day

"We've learned a lot of things we didn't know in 1988," said McKeag. About 300 people have been interviewed in connection with the mysterious disappearance of Lois Hanna.

Hanna was declared legally dead in Ontario Division Court in Walkerton a year ago.

'My daughter Lois has been missing for nearly nine years. Lois is my only daughter and I know that she wouldn't leave without telling me or the boys.

"One weekend she was with us and the next morning she was gone - vanished without a trace. She was 25 when she left and now she will be 34.

"I am appealing to anyone who could help find my daughter. It has been lonely and sad time without her.
