The park has 55 sites about half of them are serviced with water and hydro. In 1967 we applied for a Centennial grant and received it and built the pavilion and living quarters for the caretakers. Later a washroom was built with showers. This used a lot of water and we had water problems and had to drill a second well. Since that we have had coin operated devices installed on the showers. It helped a great deal as well as giving a good income.

Each year more hydro and water services are put in, also some more dusk to dawn lights have been installed. A shuffle board was put in and it seems the campers enjoy it.

When the park was first bought it could not be deeded to the Women's Institute so it was deeded to Amabel Township. It was in 1970 that we began to feel that we didn't have much in writing to show for our work. We went to a lawyer and had a lease drawn for ten years with a renewable clause for another ten years with Amabel Township. It was to be \$30 a year which was to cover the insurance but as we all know prices have risen so much the insurance is now over \$600. The lease will be expired in 1991. So if we still want to continue we will need to go back to council to negotiate a new lease.

At first there were five institute groups involved, we are sorry to say that in 1987 Elsinore Institute folded and in 1988 Hepworth folded, so now the board consists of Park Head, Allenford and Zion and two representatives from Amabel Council.

Shirley Lewis was caretaker for five years. We are sorry that due to health reasons she had to resign. We are now looking for a new caretaker for the 1989 season.

I hope I have been able to explain to some of you some of the highlights and points of interest, but I also know there are many of you who can well remember the work bees etc. back years ago.
