Local man killed on trip

A six-week holiday in the sun in the southwestern United States for a local couple ended tragically Tuesday morning when their van crashed into a stalled truck on a slippery, foggy highway in New Mexico.

Lloyd Burt, 63, of RR 1 Allenford, the driver of the van, was killed instantly in the crash. His wife Olive, 62, is in hospital in Albuquerque, N.M. with multiple fractures to the lower left leg.

On Monday, the Burts began the trip home from a winter home they owned in Yuma, in far southwestern Arizona, where they had gone for winter holidays for most of the last six years, their son-in-law, Bill Glassford of Purple Valley, said Wednesday night.

Also injured in the crash were Mrs. Burt's sister, Grace Shropshire and her husband Charlie, of Schomberg, east of Orangeville, who had accompanied the Burts on the holiday. They were not seriously injured but they were also in hospital.

The Shropshires and Mrs. Burt may return home this weekend, Glassford said.

Mr. Burt was well known in the local farming community, as he farmed at Purple Valley from 1963 to 1972. Before that he farmed at Orton, southwest of Orangeville. He was a native of Hillsburgh, south of Orangeville.

More recently, he was a laborer at the Bruce Nuclear Power Development. As was the case in recent years, he was laid off again this winter, Glassford said.

The Burts have seven children — five sons and two daughters.

They got as far as about Albuquerque when the accident occurred, Glassford said. The tractor-trailer had jackknifed and stalled on a highway, where there had apparently been a number of accidents that morning because of the weather, he said.
