
ollin Zettler was all over the field last week as he helped his Hanover Pharmasave teammates achieve a 3-1 win over Hanover New Life Mills.

2. There are several issues of concern for the next council. The debt will limit the capital projects. The current debt – \$5.5 million


When combined with the one-third federal and provincial funding that equates to \$2.25 million not available for street
