## Gale force winds batter F damage heavy as clean-t



Last week's storm did substantial amounts of damage to trees and property in the Hanover-Walkerton-Elmwood area, as graphically illustra-ed in the two accompanying photographs. Some strates ranged in excess of \$10,000. At top, tree, measuring roughly one metre in uran, was blown over by the winds onto other trees and power lines. The fallen tree knocked out

Extensive damage also occurred in Hanover itself with the tree in front of Chateau Saugeen Villa snapping off at its base, the sign at the Canadian Tire Store on Tenth Street was shattered, a trailer at a gas station was overturned, and countless branches broke away frm trees, posing a hazard to traffic or pedestrians.
