

GATHERS ONE TO TWO THOUSAND EGGS A DAY

Harold Poechman of R R 2, Walkerton, has a flock of 3600 pullets which started laying eggs about two weeks ago. With a flock this size, Mr. Poechman is able to gather about one or two thousand eggs a day. Unable to get a fair price from the egg grading stations, Mr. Poechman has resorted to giving the pigs on

his farm an egg diet. Mr. Poechman said, "one egg grading station wouldn't even give me aprice, while others offered from one to four cents a dozen. Twenty-

five years ago, eggs at three cents a dozen, were considered cheap pig-food, so I've decided to use my eggs for the same purpose". - Staff Photo
