THE CRISPIN BRIDGE

The First Bridge to cross the Saugeen River in this immediate area was a wooden structure built in 1862. This bridge was washed out in 1870 and a wooden bridge was once again constructed. Another bridge was built in 1885 and in 1901 a steel structure was built. This bridge served until earlier this year.

The new concrete structure had construction commenced in 1987 and is now being Officially Opened. We thank the Province of Ontario through the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for their generous funding for this project.
