Land deeds show that on May 7, 1879, Emil Waukel purchased from John mcGillivray the east half of Lot 12, con. 2, Saugeen Twp. Two years previous he had purchased the west half of Lot 12, Con. 2, from Henry Hilker. Therefore Lot 12 became a hundred acre farm on May 7, 1879.

Lots 11 and 12 were joined to make a 200 acre farm when Frederick Schildroth purchased from Albert Osborne the hundred acres in Lot 12, Con. 2, Saugeen Twsp. Feb. 16, 1918.

Lots 11 and 12 continued as a 200 acre farm until October 12. 1946 when Fred. Schildroth sold Lot 11 and 75 acres from Lot 12 to his son Norman.

During the 1930's Mr. Fred Schildroth also owned Lot 13, Con. 2, Saugeen, but sold it to his son, Don D. MacGillivray 50 ac. Louis, about the time of Louis' marriage in 1938.

> On October 12, 1946 Mr. Fred Schildroth sold to his son, Louis, twenty-five acres from the south-east corner of Lot 12.

Norman John Schildroth was born at Lot 15. Concession 2, Saugeen. The farm was later owned by his brother William Schildroth. Date of Norman's birth was December 14, 1914, exactly a week after the death of his older sister, Edith Louise. She passed away at the age of 11 years 11 months and three days. Death was due to diabetes. She had been active until the time of her death, and had attended S.S. #5, Saugeen during the week of her passing.
