

## MRS. JAMES CLAZIE. (1862 - 1955).

Mrs. James Clazie, a native of Saugeen, and one of the oldest continuous residents of the Township, passed away on Friday, November 4th, at the home of her son, Grant, on the 4th Concession. She was in her 93rd year.

Deceased, who was the former Mary Elizabeth Leeder, was born on the 6th Concession of Saugeen, moving to reside on the 4th, on her marriage in 1891 to her late husband, who predeceased her in 1933. She was a Communicant of Port Elgin United Church, and was for many years closely associated with the church Women's organizations. In her younger days she was also an active member of the Women's Institute.

Survivors include four sons, Jack of Windsor; Edward of Pincher Creek, Alberta, James of Hudson, Quebec, and Grant of Saugeen; and three daughters, Pearl, Mrs. Nelson Ribey of Saugeen, Martha, Mrs. Dave MacDonald of Agincourt, and Marjorie, R. N., of Beeton. A brother, Robert H. Leeder, residing in Cuba, and a sister, Hannah, Mrs. John Guyer, of Port Elgin, also survive her.

The late Mrs. Clazie was laid to rest in Sanctuary Park on Monday, November 7th, following the funeral service, conducted by the Rev. W. D. Elmslie. Pallbearers were Messrs. Verne Baker, Cecil McClinton, Kent Lamont, James Wright, Archie McCulloch and Moffatt Jamieson.

Mrs. William Jeffrey a life long resident of the district, passed away in the Saugeen Memorial Hospital on Friday, March 1st, 1957, following an illness of ten day's duration. She was in her 83rd year.

Deceased, the former Margaret McInnis, was born on the 12th Concession of Bruce, residing there until her marriage in 1899, when with her husband, she moved to the 4th of Saugeen and lived there for some 48 years, moving to the 12th of Bruce some ten years ago. She was a Presbyterian, a member of the Ladies Aid of that church, and of the Women's Institute. Her husband predeceased her in 1928.

Surviving are two sons, John of Fergus, and David of North Bruce; two daughters, Mary, Mrs. Millan Jamieson of Fergus and Donalda, R. N., of Toronto. A third son, Walter, of London, predeceased her in July of last year. There are also two brothers surviving; Malcolm of Medicine Hat, Alberta, and Angus of Murrayville, B. C., and a sister, Mayne, Mrs. Roy Ryan of Owasso, Michigan.
