Area couple married North Derby church

Given in marriage by her parents, the bride wore a polyester gown, fashioned with a high neckline, semi-Empire waistline and long fitted sleeves. The gown was trimmed with self-fabric and buttons and two V's of lace on the bodice, this continued through the princess lines of the long skirt, finishing round the skirt and self train.

A cloche arrangement held the shoulder length veil and she carried a bouquet of white Cymrium orchids, orange roses and English ivy cresting a white Bible.
