The Community was saddened to learn of the death of a highly esteemed resident of Port Elgin, William George Williams on August 3rd, 1977, following an illness of one week. Mr. Williams passed away in Saugeen Memorial Hospital, Southampton; he was in his 80th year.

Born in Dawn Township, Lambton County, he was a son of the late James and Mary Jane (Budd) Williams.

In November, 1925, he married Blanche Rushton, and they farmed in Bruce Township for 19 years, moving to the former Rushton farm (Goderich Road) in 1944, before retiring to Port Elgin 25 years ago.
