Annie Elizabeth Wardrop, the former Annie Schwass, widow of the late Malcolm Wardrop passed away in the Saugeen Memorial Hospital, Southampton on January 29th, 1972.

She was born on the 2nd Con. of Saugeen Township in 1890, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Schwass.

ANDREW B. MUIR

A well known and highly respected former resident of this area, Andrew B. Muir, passed away at Brucelea Haven, Walkerton on Saturday, February 23rd, 1974 aged 91 years.

He was born on Lot 3, Conc. 12 in Bruce Township on August 25th, 1882, the youngest child of the late William Muir and Sarah Smyth Muir.

He assisted his parents farming until they retired late in 1907, when he went to British Columbia, and later to Montana.

In December 1915, he returned to Port Elgin to take care of his aged parents for the remainder of their lives.

In 1924 he was married to Mrs. Belle McIvor Morrow, and in March 1925 he purchased his brother Jas. B. Muir's farm on Concession 4, Saugeen Township, where they lived until retiring to Port Elgin in 1947.

He was interested in community affairs, having been a School Trustee for 15 years, and a member of Saugeen Council for 5 years. He was a member of the Saugeen Memorial Hospital Board for 15 years, and the Port Elgin Co-Operative Board of

Directors for 25 years. Mr. Muir was also a charter member of the Bruce Central Credit Union and was Assessor of Saugeen Township for 14 years and Tax Collector for 10 years.

He was a member of the Port Elgin United Church, and had served as a member of Session for some years.

His wife predeceased him in August 1966 and he continued to reside in Port Elgin until October 1969 when he went to Brucelea Haven in Walkerton.

Mr. Muir was predeceased by three brothers and four sisters.

He is survived by one daughter, Isabel, Mrs. Peter Merklinger of Kitchener and one stepson Ivor Morrow of Port Elgin. Also surviving are three step grandsons and one step great granddaughter.

Funeral services were conducted from the W. Kent Milroy Funeral Chapel, Port Elgin, on Tuesday, February 26th by Rev. Ross Cumming.

While resident in Port Elgin, Miss Clark took a keen interest in community affairs and ably fulfilled the many requests she received for her services. Among other things, she will be remembered for her gift to the town of decorative Centennial lights across the main street.

Funeral service was conducted at the Ratz-Bechtel Funeral Home, Kitchener on Monday, May 31st, followed by committal in Sanctuary Park Chapel, Port Elgin, conducted by Rev. R.D. MacDonald, Tolmie Memorial Presbyterian Church where Miss Clark was a member. The large attendance attested to the esteem in which she was held.
