by a John Urquhart who went on foot from Kincardine, right through the area to Southampton. After this came the mail coaches which provided the necessary service, until it was all re-organized under Government contract.

The first Postmaster was Alex

H.R.Kennedy, who resigned after only six months. He was followed by John Jacob Lehnen (1855-1867). In 1868 Archibald Roy became Postmaster until his death in 1870. He was followed by Mrs. Mary J. Roy who held the position for 19 years, retiring in 1889. Henry N. Roy took over for 19 years until his death in 1916. Then Miss G. Gray served for 20 years until her resignation in 1936. James Edgar Rushton was then appointed, serving for 13 years. William Scarr took over in 1949 and was Postmaster until he retired in 1970, being succeeded by Postmaster Harry C. Allin.
