John Dunlop died suddenly at home in his chair on Thursday, December 19th, 2002 at the age of 79, John Dunlop of Port Elgin. Loved husband of Norma (nee) Ribey. Dad of Ken and his wife Janet, Carol and her husband Don McDermid, Karen and her husband Gerry Moss, Rob and his wife Carla, Barry and his wife Susan, Tricia and her husband Tim Bernard, all of Port Elgin, and Brian and his wife Anna of Stittsville. Grampa will be missed by his eighteen grandchildren. The eldest grandchild, Andy, is presently in Seoul, Korea teaching English. John is also survived by his sister Christena Gibson of Port Elgin, his in-laws and many nieces and nephews. He is predeceased by his brother Ross and his sister Rita McGillivray.

John was born up the Town Line in Saugeen Township, in the home of his parents, Bert and Tena Dunlop. As a child he walked along the railroad tracks to school to attend S.S.#15. He would often get a ride on the train to school, if he timed it just right. Like many young farm boys in those days, he never got to go to town to attend high school, as he was needed to work on his father's farm. When World War II came, John enlisted, along with his three best buddies. But John had a hearing problem and was not accepted. All 3 of his friends died at Dieppe and are buried there. He was able to visit their gravesites a few years ago, and that was important to him. John assisted in the war effort by working in a meat-packing plant in Toronto. After the war, John moved to Owen Sound where he went to work for White Rose, then BA Oil, delivering oil to homes and farms up and down the peninsula. Laid off from BA Oil, he went to work for the Department of Highways and drove the very first highway snow blower up to this area. When you drive from Arthur to Orangeville you will see the rows of trees planted along the road by John and his crew. During this time John married Norma Ribey, in September of 1947 at Wesley United Church. Then in 1949 John had a chance to begin a BA Oil distributing business in Port Elgin. In the early days he drove to Owen Sound each day to fill up his truck to do his day's deliveries. Soon thereafter he established a plant in Port Elgin and for the next 53 years was in the oil business. In 1950 his brother Ross joined John, forming Dunlop Bros., the parent company of Dunlop Fuels. John was married to Norma for 55 years.

They raised 7 children and saw each of their children grow up and establish families of their own. His eighteen grandchildren found the soft spot in his heart. Six of the children live in Port Elgin and they and their families can often be found at John's house for Sunday dinner. Now sons Rob and Barry and son-in-law Don will continue the family business. Visitation was held at the W. Kent Milroy Port Elgin Chapel, on December 22, 2002. The Port Elgin Lodge #429 A.F. & A.M. held a memorial service in the funeral home on the Sunday evening. The South-Port Chapter #314 Order of the Eastern Star also held a memorial service in the funeral home on the Sunday evening.
