LAMBETH - The massive Westlakes condominium community project was put on hold Monday by Westminster Township council while it decides how it wants to develop the land tucked up against London's southwestern boundary.

Council immediately put the wheels in motion for a study of the "fringe perspective" area that includes the 90 hectares (221 acres) where the proposed community of 4,800 would be located.

The plan by Livingston Holdings Ltd. of London calls for creation of nearly 1,800 housing units at the southeast quadrant of Southdale and North Talbot roads - only 260 metres or 850 feet from London's boundary

The community would nearly double Westminster's population of 6,000 and feature self-contained water and sewer systems, eight man-made lakes, commercial outlets and recreational facilities.

Reeve Dave Murray told council the township planning advisory committee felt it couldn't accept or reject what would be the largest project in Westminster history without doing an in-depth study of the fringe area.

The hurry-up study will cover such key issues as water supply and sewage disposal, land use and future development priorities.

Development of the fringe area has been a touchy subject over the years, with the township's commercial sector growing steadily within ster by annexation.
