



WHERE SHOULD I USE MY NEW MUNICIPAL ADDRESS?

The Town urges you to use your new address wherever you may have used your old one in addition to a variety of other applications. For example:

- mailing address
- informing visitors of your location
- identifying your location for delivery services
- identifying your location for emergency situations
- anywhere else you may have used you old means of property identification



MUST I PURCHASE A SIGN FROM THE TOWN?

No. In the rural areas, a standard sign will assist in property identification. Town signs are reflective for ease of reading at night. Any resident has the option of purchasing a Property Identification Sign from the Town, but it is not mandatory. A resident may wish to construct a sign of their own as an alternative or erect house numbers. All signs/numbers are to be erected in accordance with the policies of the Town of Westminster. The important matter is to have a sign or numbers which can be easily read is very visible.



WILL MAS BE RECOGNIZED BY EMERGENCY SERVICES AND OTHER PUBLIC UTILITIES?

YES, all applicable emergency services and public utilities have been informed of the improved means of property identification. The new system will assist in making emergency responses more efficient for all parties involved.



WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR MY PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION SIGN?

Property identification signs can be erected either on the face of a building which is within one hundred (100) feet of the roadway or, alternatively on a post which is to be located within ten (10) feet of the front property line. In either case, the municipal numbers must be clearly visible from the public roadway and be a minimum of five (5) inches in height mounted on a plate or board which enhances the visibility of the municipal numbers.
