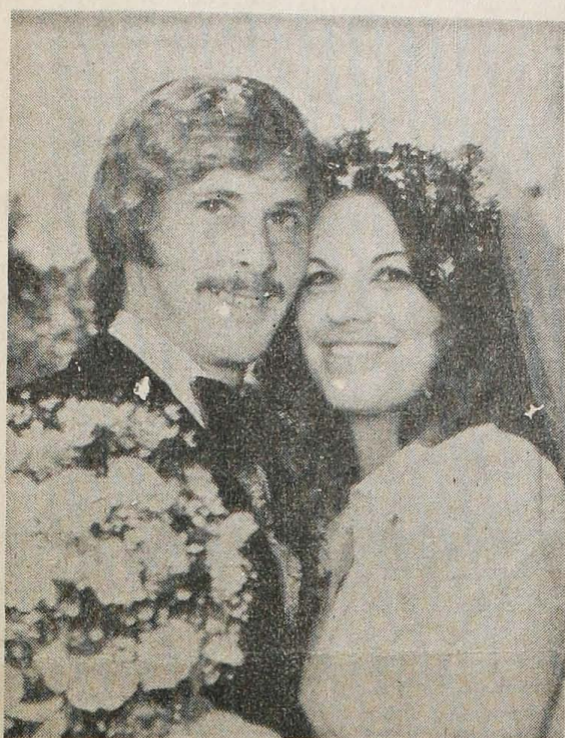


Dukelow - Hoffman Wedding

Woodville United Church was decorated with pink and white gladioli, white carnations and forget-me-nots on September 7, 1974, for the 5:30 p.m. wedding of Christine Ruth Hoffman, of Lindsay, daughter of Mrs. Ruth Hoffman of Stratford and the late Mr. Rock Hoffman, to Lynn William Dukelow, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Dukelow of Woodville. Rev. George Phillips officiated at the ceremony and the organist was Miss Merle Campbell of Woodville.

The bride was escorted into the church and was given in marriage by her mother. She wore a self-designed gown of parchment blue swiss voile, voile, with an Elizabethan neckline and collar of bias fabric, matching the skirt, a fitted bodice and empire waist, with a matching band and back bow. The gown had full length puffed sleeves, trimmed with a bias ruffle and a button loop wrist closing. The full sweeping gored skirt and cathedral train were of a coordinating parchment blue voile with a satin stripe and edge of the train, also of the same frill. Her headdress, a wreath of miniature white carnations, baby's breath, forget-me-nots and fern, held an elbow length veil of parchment blue French tulle and she carried a colonial bouquet of white sweetheart roses, miniature white carnations, forget-me-nots, baby's breath and ivy. She also wore an heirloom cameo necklace, a gift from her grandmother, Mrs. Hilda Farrow of Kitchener and she carried a "borrowed" white lace handkerchief.

The matron-of-honor was Mrs. Karen Fitzsimmons of Whitby. She wore a gown of parchment pink Swiss voile with a satin stripe, Victorian style, with a high wedding band collar and bias inset edged with pink lace. The full length puffed sleeves was also bias and trimmed at the wrists with lace. The skirt was of full sweeping gored style. She wore pink sweetheart roses in her hair and carried a colonial nosegay of miniature pink and white carnations, pink sweetheart roses and ivy. She also wore a pink cameo pin, a gift of the bride.

The best man was Carl Jewell of Woodville.

For the reception at the Country Squire Motel, Lindsay, the bride's mother received, wearing a full length gown with multi color floral brocade bodice, empire style, full length sleeves of pale blue chiffon, with a flowing skirt. Her corsage was of pink sweetheart roses, white miniature carnations and ivy. The bridegroom's mother assisted, wearing a full length gown of mint green jersey with a bottle green mandarin collar and a corsage of pink sweetheart and white miniature car-
